The selected artist will be awarded \$2000 commission and paid travel to an event TBD in Nevada 2024 where the poster will be unveiled, displayed and celebrated by partners, tribes and the public. The poster will be printed and promoted online for outreach, education and as promotional material for tribes and partners. The artist will receive AIANTA Individual Membership for a year and be featured on social media and other promotions.
